What are we really throwing away?

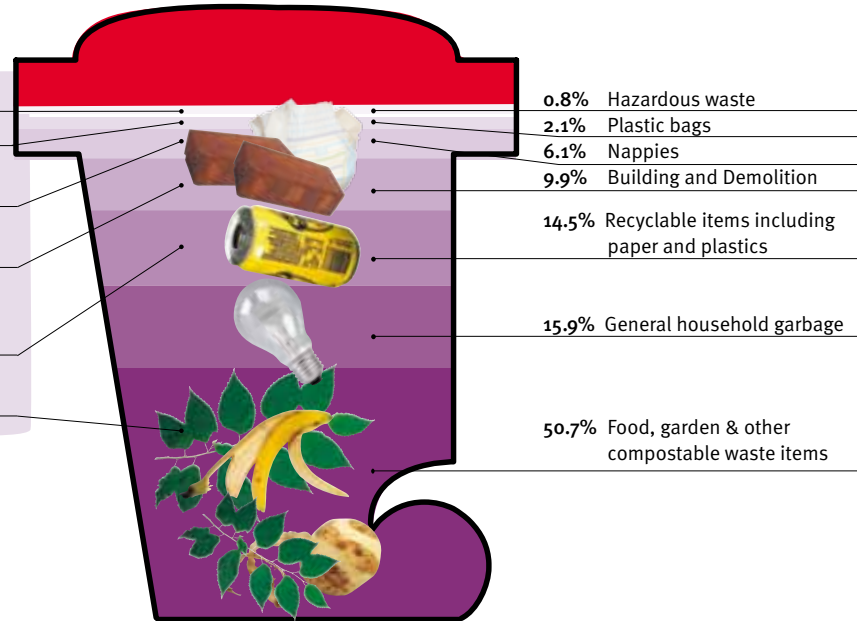
In NSW, the State Government has set waste reduction targets for Local Government to reduce waste to landfill by 66% by 2014. To achieve this, Council, residents and business need to work together to minimise waste to landfill and recover more recyclables. We encourage all residents to separate standard recyclables, green waste and other materials from the general waste stream.

Currently, Wollongong Council residents recover approximately 16,000

tonnes of recycling material and 20,000 tonnes of green waste material annually which is a great effort. Council residents are also generating around 38,000 tonnes of general waste which goes to landfill each year. This means the average household is still sending about 740kg of waste to landfill each year. By taking a few simple actions, you could cut this waste by up to 84%. Composting the food and garden waste alone could reduce the volume to landfill by 370kg per household per year.

The image on the right shows the estimated breakdown of the red top garbage bin from an average household in the Wollongong Local Government Area.

- TOXIC – should be held over for the annual Chemical Cleanout.
- Supermarket plastic bags can usually be returned for recycling.
- Try using reusable cloth nappies, a nappy service or a range of Eco-friendly compostable nappies on the market.
- Take builders waste to either Helensburgh Waste Depot or Cleary Brothers Builders Tip.
- Clean paper, cardboard and recyclables with the symbols R, 1, 2, 3, 4, 5 and 6 should be placed in the yellow top recycle bin.
- Food & garden waste is a great resource to reuse on your garden. Set up a compost or worm farm.



Frequently Asked Questions - stolen, damaged and missed bins

1. Why has my bin not been emptied?

If there is a sticker on the bin it means that there was a problem and our contractor could not collect it. If you need more information call Council's Customer Service Centre on 4227 7111. Make the necessary changes and your bin will be ready for your next allocated collection day.

2. What happens if my bin is stolen?

If your bin is stolen, call Council and we will arrange our contractors to deliver a free replacement bin to your home within three working days.

3. What happens if my bin is damaged?

If your bin is damaged, call Council's Customer Service Centre and explain the problem. Place the bin in a visible spot for access. It will be repaired or replaced for free, within five working days.

4. What happens if I move to another address?

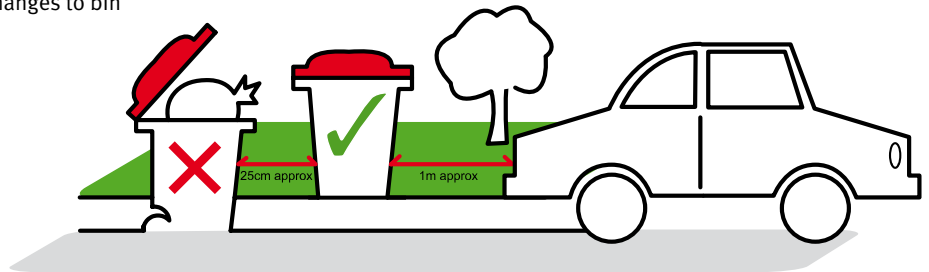
Do not take your bins with you. If you are moving to new premises, contact Council to organise new bins.

5. Can I change the size of my garbage bin?

Yes. If you want a smaller or larger garbage bin the owner of the property can ask for a free changeover once a year prior to the end of February. If you rent the premises, advise the managing agent or the owner of your needs. Bins will be exchanged towards the end of June each year. The domestic waste management levy will then be adjusted accordingly. Changes to bin sizes at other times will incur an administration fee.

How to place your bins on the kerb for collection

- ✓ Place your bins out no later than 6am on your collection day and remove them from the kerb on the day they are serviced.
- ✓ Make sure your bins do NOT weigh more than 80kg.
- ✓ Do not overfill bins or jam items into your bin; ensure that the lid is able to be closed.
- ✓ Do not place bins behind other bins on the nature strip and ensure there are no cars, trees or obstacles blocking access to your bins.
- ✓ If you live in a cul-de-sac, don't park your car in the turning area on collection day to ensure the truck can turn safely.
- ✓ Place your bin so that the bin lid opens toward the road.
- ✓ Wash your bin regularly.
- ✓ Bins are Council owned and it is illegal to remove bins from a property.
- ✓ Do not place bins on the roadway.

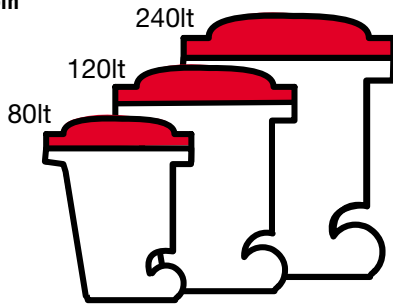

Your garbage collection is a weekly service and will go out with either your yellow top recycling bin or green waste bin.

BINS ARE TO BE PLACED OUT NO LATER THAN 6AM ON YOUR COLLECTION DAY, AND MUST BE REMOVED FROM THE KERB ON THE DAY THEY ARE SERVICED.

Residents are offered the choice of an 80 litre, 120 litre or 240 litre red top garbage bin. **You can upsize or purchase an additional red top garbage bin through Council if your current bin isn't sufficient.**

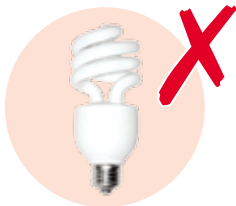

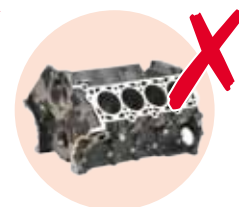
NO televisions (FREE with your household cleanup service or taken to Council's Waste Depots for recycling. A fee applies)



NO computers (FREE with your household cleanup service or taken to Council's Waste Depots for recycling. A fee applies)



NO syringes, pharmaceuticals or medical waste (containing body tissue or fluids)



NO car parts (scrap metal drop-off for FREE at Waste Depots for recycling)



NO hazardous chemicals including pesticides, poisons, & pool chemicals, etc. (Dispose FREE of charge at annual chemical collection)

Your Recycling Service

Place the yellow top recycling bin out fortnightly with your regular garbage. Remember your recycling is collected on the alternate week to your green waste bin.

Residents are able to purchase an additional recycling bin through Council if one bin isn't sufficient. You are also able to drop off additional recyclables for FREE at Whytes Gully and Helensburgh Waste Depots.

BINS ARE TO BE PLACED OUT NO LATER THAN 6AM ON YOUR COLLECTION DAY, AND MUST BE REMOVED FROM THE KERB ON THE DAY THEY ARE SERVICED.

Your recyclables are taken to the Materials Recycling Facility (MRF) at Whytes Gully where the items are sorted, baled and sent to be recycled. The recycling material collected from residents is reprocessed into new products including clothing, furniture, compost bins, food containers and newspapers.

Make more space in your recycling bin by REMOVING ALL LIDS AND CRUSHING PLASTIC BOTTLES and FLATTEN CARDBOARD PRODUCTS. Lids including plastic and metal lids from bottles, jars and containers should be placed in your recycling bin separately. Rinsing milk, dairy or pet food tins and containers will help to reduce any odour in your recycling bin.

Did you know that by placing the wrong items in your bin, you could contaminate a whole truck load of recycling material? Please recycle wisely.

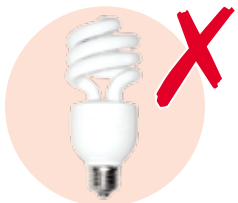

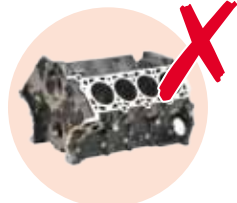

Your Green Waste Service

Place the green waste bin out fortnightly with your regular garbage. Remember your green waste is collected on the alternate week to your recycle bin.

Residents are able to purchase an additional green waste bin through Council if one bin isn't sufficient. You are also able to drop off additional or oversized green waste (greater than 50cm long or more than 7.5cm in diameter) for a fee at Whytes Gully and Helensburgh Waste Depots.

BINS ARE TO BE PLACED OUT NO LATER THAN 6AM ON YOUR COLLECTION DAY, AND MUST BE REMOVED FROM THE KERB ON THE DAY THEY ARE SERVICED.

The green waste collected from residents diverts over 20,000 tonnes of green waste per year from landfill and puts these valuable organics back into our soils.

Place your green waste bin out for collection **every fortnight** to avoid bin odour from grass clippings and reduce the need for regular cleaning.

DO NOT JAM OR COMPACT GREEN WASTE INTO BINS. DON'T TIE OR PUT GREEN WASTE INTO PLASTIC BAGS.



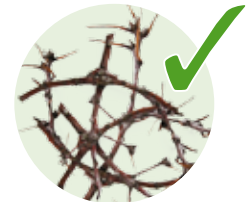

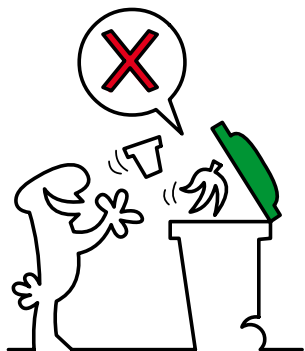
Your green waste bin will not be collected if:

- It is overfilled and the lid cannot be closed;
- The wrong items are placed in the bin;
- It is too heavy for collection vehicles to lift.

The weight of your green waste bin should be no heavier than 80kg.

Tips to help keep your green waste bin lean and green:

- only mow dry grass
- open lid of bin to let moist grass dry out
- remove dirt from vegetation
- don't overload with heavy wood or branches

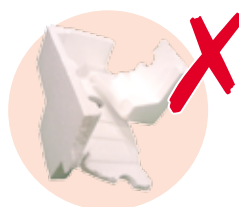
NO chemically treated (eg. CCA) or painted timber including lattice



NO fruit & vegetable scraps. These can be used in a worm farm or compost



NO pizza boxes



NO foam including packing, styrofoam & polystyrene



NO building material



NO soil or rocks



NO noxious weeds - bag & tie & place out in Household Cleanup Service or place in red top garbage bin.

NO cardboard, paper or newspaper

GREEN WASTE SERVICE

Your Annual Household Cleanup Service

Residents receive one bulky hard rubbish collection per year. The annual household cleanup service removes bulky unwanted waste from residences that cannot be placed in your garbage bin.

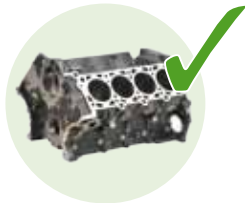

REMEMBER: CLEANUP MATERIALS MUST BE PLACED OUT THE DAY BEFORE THE COLLECTION .

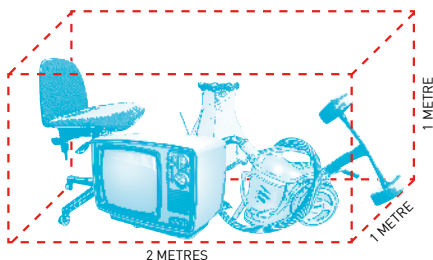
Fines and penalties may apply for: material put on the kerbside outside booked collection date, and illegally dumped materials including items not accepted; items left in parks and reserves; items left in front of other residents properties or items placed out after your collection date.

How much can I put out for collection?

Residents are invited to place up to 2 box trailer loads, which is equal to 2 cubic metres (2m³) out for the cleanup collection.

Cleanup materials must be

- ✓ Placed out the day before the collection.
- ✓ Tied, wrapped or boxed.
- ✓ Placed between gutter and footpath in front of your premises.
- ✓ Able to be handled by two people; for example: small items of furniture, radios, kitchen appliances, etc; less than 2m lengths of carpet, linoleum, etc.
- ✓ Place items neatly to ensure the contractor can safely access and handle your items.
- ✓ Place items so they won't fall on the roadway or footpath.



NO recyclables



NO building material (can be taken to Helensburgh Waste Depot or to Cleary Brothers Builder's tip)



NO fridges (call Fridge Buyback on 1800 708 401)



NO bulky or general garden waste, palm leaves or tree stumps



NO motor oil (FREE drop off to Whytes Gully or Helensburgh Waste Depots for recycling)



NO household waste or foodscraps



NO large (over 2m length) or heavy materials such as beds, lounges, dining tables, etc. (more than two people can handle)



NO containers of liquid paints (dispose FREE of charge at annual chemical collection)



NO large white goods including washing machines & stoves. (Items made mostly of steel can be taken free of charge to Council's Waste Depots for recycling)

Your Waste Depots

Wollongong City Council has two licensed Waste Depots. These facilities can be utilised for: FREE drop off of additional recyclable material which cannot fit in your yellow top bin; FREE drop off of bulky metals and whitegoods; drop off of bulky green and wood waste (fee applies); FREE drop off of reusable items at the Revolve Centre at Whytes Gully; drop off of specified recyclable items (fees apply), and for disposal of bulky materials that cannot be placed in your bins or included in the cleanup.

Sort And Save

Residents are encouraged to sort their waste as they pack it into their vehicle, in order to make it easier to separate on arrival at either of Council's Waste Depots.

By being able to clearly identify the different materials and separate recyclables from general waste, you will save time and money.

Handy tips:

- ✓ Put general rubbish at bottom of your load.
- ✓ Place clean separated green waste so it can be unloaded cleanly from general rubbish. Contaminated green waste will be charged as general waste.
- ✓ Place separate standard recyclables, metals and reusables so they can be dropped off FREE of charge.
- ✓ Place E-waste, mattresses and tyres on top of your load separate from any standard recyclables.

Refer to the table below in helping you sort your load and to work out how much select items will cost to dispose of.

REMEMBER TO COVER YOUR LOAD! Transport your waste responsibly, and don't risk a fine.

Revolve

Reusable items accepted include furniture; sporting and camping goods; toys; clothes; blankets and linen; rugs; books; cutlery and crockery; lawn mowers; tools; washing machines; driers and fridges; building materials (eg. wood, doors, windows, baths, etc)

Items such as computers, televisions, mattresses, tyres, other electrical items, paint or household chemicals are not accepted.

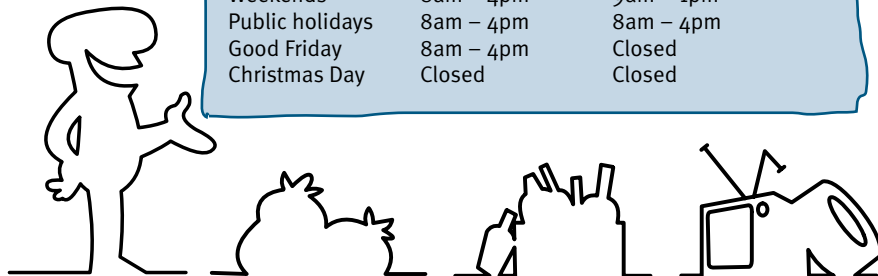
Reusable items must be in reasonable condition and/or working order to enable resale. Items that are soiled, damaged or not working will be refused at Revolve's discretion and shall be required to be disposed of as general waste with fees and charges applying.

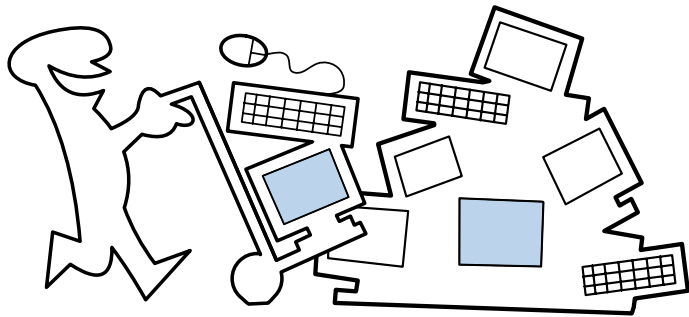
FREE Chemical Clean out

Some common household products can harm your family and the environment. Make your home safer by using this FREE service.

Items suitable for collection include: solvents and household cleaners; floor care products; ammonia based cleaners; fluorescent globes and tubes; car batteries; motor oils, fuels and fluids; paint and paint related products; pesticides and herbicides; poisons; gas bottles; fire extinguishers; pool chemicals; hobby chemicals; acids and alkalis.

Only household quantities are accepted up to 20kg or 20L max container size. Please transport your household chemicals carefully and remain in your vehicle at the drop off site.

Electronic Waste (E-waste)

Wollongong City Council recognises the growing demand for recycling of Electronic Waste (E-waste). As part of our ongoing commitment to assisting residents in addressing this problem, E-waste items will now be accepted for collection as part of the Annual Household Cleanup Service.

Acceptable E-waste for collection includes IT equipment such as computers, monitors, hard drives, and consumer electronics such as televisions, audio equipment, cables and video players.

Select E-waste items can also be taken to Council's Waste Depots throughout the year, where they will be recycled. A recycling fee applies.

The Australian Government is looking to develop a national approach for the treatment of unwanted E-waste in 2011. The industry-led scheme would support the collection and recycling of end of life televisions and computers.

Syringe and Sharps Disposal Service

The safe way to handle and dispose of your used syringes and sharps to ensure a healthy and secure home environment is to participate in the FREE Syringe and Sharps Disposal Service.

Finger prickers (lancets), pen needles for insulin pens and syringes should NOT be placed in your household recycling bin, waste bin or public litter bin.

Always make sure your sharps are secured in a strong plastic container, for example:

- ✓ An Australian Standard sharps container
- ✓ A puncture-resistant plastic container with a screw top

Glass containers or plastic soft drink/water bottles are NOT recommended.

Store your container out of reach of children and when the container is $\frac{3}{4}$ full, take your container to a participating pharmacy.

Return Unwanted Medicines (RUM)

(RUM) is a program where you can take unwanted or out of date medicines along to your local pharmacy and hand them over to the pharmacist for proper disposal. The RUM program is available through pharmacies all year round.

Help to protect the environment, and the health and safety of your family, by ensuring old medicines are not thrown down sinks, toilets or in the garbage bin

Fridge Buyback

If you have a working second fridge in regular use, is at least 10 years old and its internal volume is 250 litres or greater, then you can participate in **Fridge Buyback**. Experienced removalists will collect your fridge FREE of charge from your home if removal involves 20 stairs or less. You will also receive a rebate if removal involves six stairs or less. **Call 1800 708 401.**

Mobile Muster

Mobile Muster is a national recycling program that collects and recycles mobile phone handsets, batteries and accessories from a network of over 3500 public drop off points including mobile phone retailers and businesses across Australia. Phone batteries can also be dropped off for FREE at Whytes Gully Waste Depot.

Where to Recycle? To find your nearest collection point, go to www.mobilemuster.com.au/Where_to_hand_em_in Alternatively you can pick up a free recycling satchel at participating Australia Post outlets. Over 90% of mobile phone components can be recycled.

Cartridges 4 Planet Ark

This program has been instrumental in collecting and recycling more than 11 million printer cartridges in seven years. You can drop off your used or empty laser and ink jet cartridges at participating Australia Post, JB Hi-Fi, Dick Smith, Tandy, The Good Guys, Harvey Norman and Officeworks stores.

To find out the drop-off locations for a wide range of items including: furniture, electronic goods and white goods, plus information on what can and can't be recycled in your local area, check out www.RecyclingNearYou.com.au

Garage Sales and Reuse

Holding your own garage sale is a great way to reuse old items instead of throwing them away, and is also an opportunity to get rid of household clutter and make some extra money. You do not need to apply for a permit to hold a garage sale on your property. Visit www.wollongong.nsw.gov.au and follow the links to Household Services.

Charity organisations - Consider REUSE before disposal

Don't dump on a charity - make sure items are reusable, resaleable, clean, unsoiled and in working condition. Charity staff will assess items and let you know if they are willing to accept the items you are offering.

Public clothing recycling bins - only place unsoiled reusable clothing, linen, blankets and manchester in these bins. It is illegal dumping to place any item outside a charity bin. Only clothing related items are accepted at these locations. Any other items are considered illegal dumping.

Waste Wise Tips

- ✓ Plan meals wisely. Do a weekly meal plan and only shop for what you need to avoid unwanted food.
- ✓ Buy fresh fruit, vegetables and meat which is unprocessed, healthier and has less packaging.
- ✓ Compost vegetable peelings and fruit scraps.
- ✓ Buy in bulk, buy concentrates or refillable items.
- ✓ Take your own reusable bags to the supermarket or use cardboard boxes.
- ✓ Use your purchasing power and give manufacturers feedback on their products.
- ✓ Choose items that can be reused many times such as sponges instead of paper towel.
- ✓ Reuse and repair products or buy quality second hand goods.
- ✓ Choose products with recyclable packaging.
- ✓ Close the loop and buy products made from recycled material.
- ✓ When buying presents, give experiences such as a dinner out or theatre tickets.
- ✓ Give presents in reusable wrapping such as a colourful ribbon instead of sticky tape.

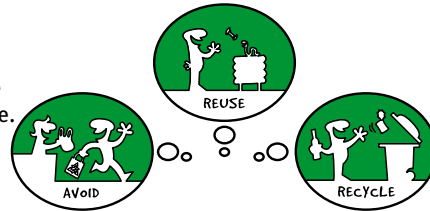
