Highlights: Recently completed works

 In a little over
 nine months, we
 reconstructed and
 reopened the causeway
 after it was destroyed
 during a declared natural
 disaster in February
 2023.
- Koala Food Forest together with Symbio Wildlife Park we're developing a Koala Food Forest at Koonawarra to help feed the growing population of koalas at Symbio, and offer an emergency food source for koalas in care.



Environmental Works

We're not just about roads and rubbish. Looking after the local environment is also key to Council's service delivery. Here's a snapshot of a few environmental projects we've recently delivered.

Poem Forest plantings, Brownsville - This year, Red Room received more than 6,400 poem entries from students and teachers across Australia. This resulted in more than 6,400 trees being planted across Wollongong, with a focus on low-canopy areas. Read all the winning nature-inspired poems at redroompoetry.org/ projects/poem-forest/.

Hooka Point - Councillor Vicky King Memorial Planting - We recognised the late Cr Vicky King with a commemorative ceremony and tree planting in Berkeley. The event recognised her 19 years of service and was attended by Cr King's family and local community members. In addition to a plaque unveiling, some 1,000 trees were planted in her memory.

Koonawarra, Eleebana Reserve

- It was many hands on deck as Lakelands Primary School students helped to plant some 700 specially selected eucalyptus tree species. In 18-24 months, the trees' leaves will be sustainably harvested as a food source for koalas in protection at Symbio.

Fire trail maintenance

We're responsible for the management of 14 fire trails across the city. After significant rainfall in 2022 and early 2023, we've repaired 11 damaged fire trails. This work has included drainage improvements, signage upgrades to meet current RFS standards, and installed gates in Dapto, Figtree, Mt Kembla, Thirroul, and Otford to reduce access by unauthorised vehicles outside Bushfire Season.

Food Organics + Garden Organics (FOGO) Education

Over 10 days we visited Bunnings stores and shopping centres to hand out 5,380 rolls of FOGO bag liners and chat with more than 6,000 residents about their FOGO habits.
