The City of Wollongong Traffic Committee is not a Committee of Wollongong City Council however a Technical Committee of the Roads & Maritime Services (RMS). The Committee operates under the authority conferred to Council by the RMS under the Transport Administration Act 1988.

Council has been delegated certain powers, from the RMS, with regard to traffic matters upon its local roads. A condition of this delegation is that Council must take into account the Traffic Committee recommendations.

There are four permanent members of the Traffic Committee, each of whom has a single vote only.

- The members are representatives of the NSW Police Force, the Roads & Maritime Services, the Local State Member of Parliament (for the location of the issue to be voted upon), and a representative of Wollongong City Council.
- If the RMS or NSW Police Force disagrees with any Traffic Committee recommendation, or Council's resolution on any Traffic Committee recommendation, that member may lodge an appeal with the Regional Traffic Committee for determination. The appeal must be lodged in writing within 14 days of Council's resolution. Any action relative to any issue under appeal must cease until the matter is determined. The Regional Traffic Committee is chaired by an independent chairperson and submissions and representations are welcomed from all interested parties.

Council can only recommend that:

- 1 The Traffic Committee recommendation be adopted.
- 2 The Traffic Committee recommendation not be adopted.
- 3 The Traffic Committee reconsider this issue.

GENERAL BUSINESS

1 HELENSBURGH

Walker Street and Whitty Road - 'No Stopping' Restrictions

Background:

A resident has requested that Council consider installing parking restrictions on the eastern side of Walker Street, immediately to the north of Whitty Road. In particular, the parking of larger vehicles in this area affects the available sight distance to approaching traffic in Walker Street.

PROPOSAL SUPPORTED UNANIMOUSLY

Install:

- 'No Stopping' Restrictions for a distance of 20 metres on the eastern side of Walker Street to the north of Whitty Road.
- Double barrier lines at intersection of Walter Street and Whitty Road.
- Edgelines around the section of 'No Stopping' to help define kerb line around Whitty Road.

2 THIRROUL

Railway Parade - Request for timed parking

Background:

Council has been contacted by the owners of two businesses in Railway Parade, Thirroul requesting that unrestricted parking in the vicinity of the businesses to be changed to timed parking. Council can consider this request, however requires permission from NSW Roads and Maritime Services to reduce the unrestricted parking within 1km of Thirroul Railway Station.

PROPOSAL SUPPORTED UNANIMOUSLY

Install 2P Parking restrictions on the western side of Railway Parade on the frontage to No 6 Railway Parade.

3 THIRROUL

Armagh Parade and Robinsville Crescent - Traffic Safety Concerns

Background:

Council has been contacted by concerned residents regarding the top corner of Robinsville Crescent and Armagh Parade, Thirroul. There is no 'Give Way' sign in either direction to indicate to drivers who is responsible for giving way when approaching the intersection. Several new houses are being built at the end of Armagh Parade which will provide increased traffic in the area; accordingly 'Give Way' restrictions for drivers in Robinsville Crescent are appropriate in these circumstances.

PROPOSAL SUPPORTED UNANIMOUSLY

Install 'Give Way' signs and the associated line marking in Robinsville Crescent on both sides of the intersection with Armagh Parade.

4 NORTH WOLLONGONG

Railway Crescent and Hindmarsh Avenue - Request for timed parking

Background:

Council has been contacted by the staff of *Flametree*; an off-site annexe of Figtree High School situated at 8 Railway Crescent, North Wollongong. *Flametree* caters for 35 secondary school students with mental health disabilities and the school has concerns regarding on-street parking in the streets adjacent to the school.

PROPOSAL SUPPORTED UNANIMOUSLY

Install 2P parking restrictions on the northern side of Hindmarsh Avenue for a distance of 30m to the east of the driveway.

5 UNANDERRA

Tallegalla Street and Princes Highway – Replacement of 'No Standing' Signs

Background:

Council's Rangers have advised that two 'No Standing' signs have been located in Unanderra. The first is located in Tallegalla Street near the Woolworths Supermarket and the second is located on the Princes Highway, immediately north of Victoria Street. 'No Standing' signs ceased to have a legal meaning with the review of the NSW Road Rules in 2008 and accordingly, these 'No Standing' signs need to be replaced with 'No Stopping' restrictions.

PROPOSAL SUPPORTED UNANIMOUSLY

Replace the 'No Standing' signs located in Tallegalla Street and the Princes Highway immediately north of Victoria Street with 'No Stopping' restrictions.

6 WARRAWONG

Junction of Turpin and Churchill Avenues - Intersection Improvements

Background:

A resident of Churchill Avenue, Warrawong has contacted Council with concerns about the traffic island at the intersection of Turpin and Churchill Avenues. It will probably assist drivers if pavement arrows were to be installed on the part of the intersection where one way traffic is appropriate.

PROPOSAL SUPPORTED UNANIMOUSLY

Install:

- Left and right arrows on pavement of the western side of the traffic island in Churchill Avenue to indicate one way northbound for traffic entering Turpin Avenue.
- A through pavement arrow in Churchill Avenue on the eastern side of the traffic island in Churchill Avenue to indicate one way southbound for traffic entering Churchill Avenue from Turpin Avenue.
- 'No Entry' signs in Turpin Avenue on the western side of the traffic island in Churchill Avenue.
- 'Give Way' signs in Churchill Avenue on the western side of the traffic island in Churchill Avenue.

REGULATION OF TRAFFIC

7 COALCLIFF

Seacliff Bridge - Seacliff Half Marathon Event

Background:

A private event organiser is proposing a half marathon running on Sunday 26th June 2016 which will run from the Council reserve on Monash Street, Coledale to Clifton School Parade, Coalcliff and return. Most of the regulation of traffic occurs on state roads and accordingly requires permission from NSW Roads and Maritime Services (NSW RMS) and the NSW Police. Both NSW RMS and NSW Police have indicated that the arrangements on Lawrence Hargrave Drive for the event area are acceptable and the application for traffic controls on Clifton School Parade and Monash Street can now be processed by Council.

The organisers have been made aware of the requirement in point 4 of the Standard Conditions for Road Closures that they must contact affected residents.

PROPOSAL SUPPORTED UNANIMOUSLY

The proposed road closures on local roads be approved subject to:

- I. The submitted traffic management plan (Attachment 2)
- II. Council's Standard Conditions for Road Closures (Attachment 1)
- III. Permission for the event from NSW Police and NSW RMS
- IV. Suitable VMS boards to be displayed at least one week prior to the event at the top of Bald Hill, the roundabout at the Princes Highway, Helensburgh; the top of Bulli Pass as well as a suitable location between Austinmer and Coledale.

8 MOUNT KEMBLA AND WEST DAPTO

Kembla Joggers - 2016 Winter Series Road Race Events

Background:

Kembla Joggers have previously conducted a race series at Kembla Grange and at Mount Kembla successfully and in 2016 there are events proposed for four Saturdays as outlined below.

The Kembla Joggers Winter Program of events does not require road closures however extensive traffic controls and a 40kph speed limit are proposed.

PROPOSAL SUPPORTED UNANIMOUSLY

The proposed regulation of traffic for the Kembla Joggers Winter Race Series 2016 be approved.

- Subject to approval from the NSW Police

9 CONISTON

Iris Avenue - New Guard Rail Installation

Background:

Council has received plans from our Design division regarding proposed line marking in Iris Avenue.

PROPOSAL SUPPORTED UNANIMOUSLY

Plan No 5729-C01 be approved. (Attachment 4)

10 WOLLONGONG

Church and Burelli Streets - Annual ANZAC Day March

Background:

The Wollongong RSL Sub Branch has advised Council of the proposed route for the annual ANZAC Day March on the 25th April, 2016. The march will follow the same route as in previous years and it is understood that the NSW Police will manage the regulation of traffic for this event.

11 WOLLONGONG

Keira Street - Taxi Zones

Background:

The section Keira Street between Crown and Flinders Streets is a NSW State Road and Council has no delegations through the Traffic Committee process to alter parking arrangements. Council has responsibility for the road side furnishings and approaches have been made by the adjoining property owner to adjust the bus zone on the western side of Keira Street in order to allow a vacant part of the development to be leased.

Council has agreed to adjust the Bus Zone in Keira Street between Crown and Market Streets to facilitate the use of an adjacent shop as a restaurant. The Bus Zone includes a night time Taxi Zone and during discussions with Wollongong Radio Cabs, the taxi operators have agreed to this night time Taxi Zone being relocated to the eastern side of Keira Street.

It is appropriate that Council reviews the bus zone on the eastern side of Keira Street, directly opposite the al fresco dining area associated with the West Keira Development. The bus zone is currently 45 m long and is mostly used for dropping off passengers and accordingly after 9pm this bus zone only needs to accommodate a single bus. The representatives of Wollongong Radio Cabs have agreed that the night time taxi zone could be relocated from the western side of Keira Street to the eastern side.

After discussion with the representative from RMS it was agreed that Council arrange to install:

- A 'No Parking' zone on the western side of Keira Street across the area currently signposted as a night time Taxi Zone, between Crown and Market Streets.
- A Taxi Zone to operate from 9pm to 6am on the eastern side of Keira Street for a distance of 25 m south of the beginning of the present full time Bus Zone between Crown and Market Streets.

LATE ITEM

12 UNANDERRA

Tannery Street – Adjustments to Taxi Zone

Background:

In relation to the Unanderra Access & Movement Strategy, there is a proposal for the Tannery Street Taxi to operate from 6pm – 6am, with ½ P from 6am to 6pm. This was agreed through engagement with local businesses. Wollongong Radio Cabs have also agreed to this adjustment, and have indicated that most taxi activity takes place in Victoria Street. Where taxis need to drop off in the vicinity of Tannery Street the drivers usually make use of one of the car parks as the need to stop is relatively brief.

PROPOSAL SUPPORTED UNANIMOUSLY

Install new signs in Tannery Street, at the existing taxi zone to indicate 'Taxi Zone 6pm – 6am' and '1/4 P 6am – 6pm'.

Attachment 1 – Standard Conditions for Road Closures

Standard Conditions for Road Closures

For Special Events and Work Related activities Within Council Road Reserves.

Following approval by Wollongong City Council, road closures are subject to the additional Council conditions:

- 1. The Applicant must complete the Council form 'Application to Open and Occupy or Underbore a Roadway or Footpath' (Refer to Checklist below relates to Section 138 of the Roads Act.)
- 2. **NSW Police Approval:** The Applicant must obtain written approval from NSW Police, where required under the Roads Act.
- 3. If the Road Closure is within 100m of any traffic control signals or on a 'State Classified Road' the Applicant must obtain a Road Occupancy Licence (ROL) from NSW Roads & Maritime Services (RMS).
- 4. **The Applicant must advise all affected residents and business owners** within the closure area of the date/s and times for the closure, at least 7 days prior to the intended date of works.
- 5. **The Applicant must advise Emergency Services:** Ambulance, Fire Brigade and Police, Taxi and Bus Companies of the closure dates and times in writing, 7 days prior to the intended date of works. The Applicant must endeavour to minimise the impact on bus services during the closure.
- 6. **Traffic Management Plan:** The closure must be set up in accordance with the approved **Traffic Management Plan (TMP)** prepared by an appropriately qualified traffic controller; a copy of whose qualifications must be included with the submitted TMP.
- 7. **Traffic Management Plan Setup:** The Traffic Management Plan must be set up by appropriately qualified traffic control persons or the NSW Police.
- 8. Access to properties affected by the road closure must be maintained where possible. Where direct access cannot be achieved, an alternative arrangement must be agreed to by both the applicant and the affected person/s.
- 9. **Public Notice Advertisement:** The Applicant must advertise the road closure in the Public Notices section of the local paper, detailing closure date/s and times at least 7 days prior to the closure.
- 10. **Public Liability Policy:** The Applicant must provide Council with a copy of their current insurance policy to a value of no less than \$20 million dollars to cover Wollongong City Council from any claims arising from the closure.






Attachment 2 - 'Seacliff Half' Marathon Event - 2 of 5







Attachment 2 - 'Seacliff Half' Marathon Event - 3 of 5



Attachment 2 - 'Seacliff Half' Marathon Event - 4 of 5




Attachment 2 - 'Seacliff Half' Marathon Event - 5 of 5







Attachment 3 – Kembla Joggers Winter Series – 1 of 14




Attachment 3 - Kembla Joggers Winter Series - 2 of 14




























