#### **GENERAL BUSINESS**

#### 1 BULLI

Spinners Way

#### **Background**

A concerned resident of Ursula Road Bulli has written to Council regarding traffic in Spinners Way. It appears that some drivers ignore the one way restrictions and drive the wrong direction leading to concerns for the safety of other drivers. The signage at the entrance and exit to Spinners Way can be duplicated so that drivers are more clearly aware of the restrictions.

#### Proposal

Install:

- a) an additional 'One Way' sign at the intersection of Spinners Way and Ursula Road
- b) an additional 'No Entry' sign and One Way sign at the intersection of Spinners Way and Farrell Road
- c) a pavement arrow at each end of Spinners Way

#### 2 WOLLONGONG

Atchison & Burelli Streets

#### Background

The Highway Patrol have reported that some drivers are making a right turn into Burelli Street from Atchison Street when travelling north, rather than observing the All Traffic Left restrictions. This appears to be occurring now that the roundabout at Auburn and Burelli Street has been replaced with Traffic Signals and a U-turn at this intersection is no longer possible. The installation of an additional All Traffic Left sign together with pavement arrows should assist drivers to make safe choices.

#### **Proposal**

Install an 'All Traffic Left' sign together with two pavement arrows in the northbound lane of Atchison Street, on the approach to Burelli Street.

#### 3 WARRAWONG

Shellharbour Road - New Parking Restrictions

#### Background

Services NSW has proposed a new vehicle registration and licensing facility for a site on King Street Warrawong which extends to Shellharbour Road. This facility will replace the existing vehicle registration centre at Nolan Street, Unanderra.

The consultants designing the new facility have requested that Council consider installing parking restrictions on Shellharbour Road to permit heavy vehicles to stand whilst the driver's undergo licence testing. The new facility will have adequate parking for vehicle inspections and staff but it will not accommodate applicants for Heavy Vehicle licences with their vehicles. The proposed location and extent of restrictions is to be tabled at the meeting.

#### **Proposal**

Council install parking restrictions to read 'No Parking - Licence Applicants for Heavy Vehicles Excepted.'

#### **REGULATION OF TRAFFIC**

#### 4 HELENSBURGH TO WINDANG Camp Quality Convoy – Sunday 18<sup>th</sup> November 2015

#### **Background**

The Camp Quality Convoy generally follows NSW State Road namely the Appin Road and the M1. One of the starting points is on the Old Princes Highway at Darkes Forest in the interests of reducing delays and congestion at the main start point on the Appin Road. These arrangements are similar to previous years and the use of the Old Princes Highway was effective in making the flow of vehicles in the Convoy easy to manage.

The organisers have indicated that residents and visitors with a destination in the vicinity of Darkes Forest will be permitted to access the area with regard to safety at the time. All other traffic is to be diverted via Lawrence Hargrave Drive and the M1. The road closure of the Princes Highway between Bulli Tops and Darkes Road is proposed for 5am to 11am on the day.

#### **Proposal**

The proposed road closure of the Old Princes Highway between Bulli Tops and Darkes Forest be approved subject to the submitted Traffic Management Plan (Attachment 2) and Council's Standard Conditions for Road Closures (Attachment 1).

#### 5 WEST WOLLONGONG

Lexburn Avenue - Street Party - 18<sup>th</sup> Dec 2015

#### Background

Council has received a request from residents in Lexburn Avenue for a street party to be held Friday 18<sup>th</sup> December 2015 from 5pm to midnight. Lexburn Avenue is one block long and located between Yellagong and Euroka Streets, where the proposed closure is at each intersection. Diversion of traffic around the closure is expected to have minimal inconvenience upon drivers.

#### **Proposal**

The proposed road closure be approved subject to Council's Standard Conditions for Street Parties.

#### 6 WOLLONGONG

Harbour Street, Crown Street, Marine Drive - Tri the Gong

#### Background

The 'Tri the Gong' Triathlon Festival is being held on Saturday and Sunday 5<sup>th</sup> and 6<sup>th</sup> of March 2016 with the same road closures as in previous years.

The event is divided into two separate competition days as follows:

Saturday 5<sup>th</sup> March – These events are centred around Endeavour Drive and Wollongong Harbour.
The road closures will take effect between 5.30am and 2pm for events extending from Endeavour Drive via
Marine Drive to the roundabout at the eastern end of Crown Street.

The road closures will take effect 2pm until 4pm for the events extending from Endeavour Drive southwards to Crown Street and then back along Marine Drive and Cliff Road to the eastern end of Bourke Street, finishing at Endeavour Drive. During the Saturday events the Bus Terminus will be closed in Marine Drive and buses will have alternative bus zones and rest facilities in Harbour Street.

II. Sunday 6<sup>th</sup> March – These events will extend from Wollongong Harbour to Elliott's Road, Fairy Meadow for the support events and involve road closures of Cliff Road, the eastern end of Bourke Street, Kembla Street between George Hanley Drive and Bourke Street, George Hanley Drive and Squires Way for the period 6.45am to 4pm.



The main Olympic standard event extends from Wollongong Harbour via Cliff Road, the eastern end of Bourke Street, Kembla Street between George Hanley Drive and Bourke Street, George Hanley Drive and Squires Way, Carter's Lane and Pioneer Road to a point immediately south of Rothery Street. Toad closures for Carters Lane and Pioneer Road between Elliott's Road and Rothery Street will be in effect from 6.30am to 11am.

The Sunday events will prevent access to all side streets along the route, and the section of Towradgi Road east of Pioneer Road and the adjoining streets will be isolated by the closures. The event organisers have agreed to have control points at the major cross streets of Elliott's Road, Carter's Lane, Towradgi Road and Murray Road to allow access across Pioneer Road/Carter's Lane. As in previous years, residents will be provided with a letter box drop and a hotline contact phone number to allow enquiries directly with the organisers.

The proposed closures involve a number of traffic signals and therefore require specific approval from NSW Roads and Maritime Services. As the events involve cycling races on public roads, all such activities also require approval from the NSW Police. Discussions have been held with Transport for NSW to coordinate the diversion of buses, particularly during the Sunday events.

#### **Proposal**

The proposed road closures be approved subject to:

- a) The submitted traffic management plans (Attachment 3)
- b) The applicant obtaining approval from NSW Roads & Maritime Services
- c) The applicant obtaining approval from NSW Police
- d) Council's Standard Conditions for Road Closures (Attachment 1)

# 7 WINDANG

Oakland Avenue

#### Background

Council has prepared a design for kerb extensions and improvements to the existing school crossing for the Windang Public School in Oakland Avenue.

Off West Dapto Road - Proposed Sub Division

#### **INFORMAL ITEMS**

9 WOLLONGONG Marine Drive Bus Terminus

#### Background

An employee of Premier Illawarra has written several times to Council requesting that the area around the terminus be fenced to discourage pedestrians moving through the area. The request has also asked for Council to improve the signage on the entrance to the terminus so that no vehicles other than service buses are permitted to enter.

Unfortunately, the terminus is in a Council reserve where it is difficult to exclude pedestrians without significant expenditure on fencing. It is also unfortunate that terms such as 'Route Bus' and 'Scheduled Service Bus' are not defined in the legislation and that pubic passenger vehicles used for hire, reward and in the course of trade are defined variously as buses. For these reasons, such vehicles cannot be legally excluded while the bus terminus remains a road related area.

It is understood some drivers are concerned for the safety of pedestrians as it is necessary from time to time for buses to reverse in the terminus. Council is considering some additions to the fencing but a more workable solution to their safety concerns may be the installation of reversing cameras on the route service buses operated by Premier Illawarra and Dion's Bus Service.

This item is included for discussion with the bus operators.

10 DAPTO, WOLLONGONG, BALGOWNIE, CORRIMAL, WOONONA, HELENSBURGH 'Waratahs Re-enactment of Recruitment March' Sunday 29<sup>th</sup> November to 13<sup>th</sup> December 2015

#### **Background**

Council has been contacted by the RMS Transport Management Centre regarding this ANZAC Commemorative event which re-enacts elements of the original Waratahs ANZAC March undertaken between Nowra and Sydney in 1915. Submitted for information.

#### Attachment 1 – Standard Conditions for Road Closures

# **Standard Conditions for Road Closures**

For Special Events and Work Related activities Within Council Road Reserves.

Following approval by Wollongong City Council, road closures are subject to the additional Council conditions:

- 1. The Applicant must complete the Council form 'Application to Open and Occupy or Underbore a Roadway or Footpath' (Refer to Checklist below relates to Section 138 of the Roads Act.)
- 2. **NSW Police Approval:** The Applicant must obtain written approval from NSW Police, where required under the Roads Act.
- If the Road Closure is within 100m of any traffic control signals or on a 'State Classified Road' the Applicant must obtain a Road Occupancy Licence (ROL) from NSW Roads & Maritime Services (RMS).
- 4. **The Applicant must advise all affected residents and business owners** within the closure area of the date/s and times for the closure, at least 7 days prior to the intended date of works.
- 5. The Applicant must advise Emergency Services: Ambulance, Fire Brigade and Police, Taxi and Bus Companies of the closure dates and times in writing, 7 days prior to the intended date of works. The Applicant must endeavour to minimise the impact on bus services during the closure.
- 6. **Traffic Management Plan:** The closure must be set up in accordance with the approved **Traffic Management Plan (TMP)** prepared by an appropriately qualified traffic controller; a copy of whose qualifications must be included with the submitted TMP.
- 7. **Traffic Management Plan Setup:** The Traffic Management Plan must be set up by appropriately qualified traffic control persons or the NSW Police.
- 8. Access to properties affected by the road closure must be maintained where possible. Where direct access cannot be achieved, an alternative arrangement must be agreed to by both the applicant and the affected person/s.
- Public Notice Advertisement: The Applicant must advertise the road closure in the Public Notices section of the local paper, detailing closure date/s and times at least 7 days prior to the closure.
- 10. Public Liability Policy: The Applicant must provide Council with a copy of their current insurance policy to a value of no less than \$20 million dollars to cover Wollongong City Council from any claims arising from the closure.





# Attachment 2 - Part 1 - Convoy 2015 - Old Princes Highway, Maddens Plain, Truck Parking




# Attachment 2 - Part 2 - Convoy 2015 - Old Princes Highway, Bulli Tops






Attachment 3 - Tri the Gong - Saturday Event - Plan 2 of 6









# Attachment 3 - Tri the Gong - Saturday Event - Plan 5 of 6




# Attachment 3 – Tri the Gong – Saturday Event - Plan 6 of 6




# Attachment 3 – Tri the Gong – Sunday Event - Plan 1 of 12





Attachment 3 - Tri the Gong - Sunday Event - Plan 3 of 12






# Attachment 3 - Tri the Gong - Sunday Event - Plan 4 of 12







# Attachment 3 - Tri the Gong - Sunday Event - Plan 5A of 12




### Attachment 3 - Tri the Gong - Sunday Event - Plan 6 of 12












