Council has been planning for social infrastructure needs for West Dapto for many years. Social infrastructure means the places and spaces in a community that help people connect, be active, create and learn. It includes community and cultural facilities such as libraries and community centres, and open spaces and recreation. We recently coordinated a needs assessment to review what the growing community in West Dapto will need in the future and will be inviting community feedback.

Dear Lord Mayor and Councillors

Council staff have been working with a consultancy team on the long-term social infrastructure needs for the growing community at West Dapto. This includes ensuring there are places and spaces for people to meet, connect, be active and learn.

Once finalised, the West Dapto Social Infrastructure Needs Assessment will inform ongoing and future work including a review of the West Dapto Development Contributions Plan.

On 28 November 2022, Council resolved that -

- 1 *Council support public exhibition of the draft West Dapto Social Infrastructure Needs Assessment for a minimum of 28 days.*
- 2 *Council exhibition material to clearly outline that delivering the Social Infrastructure Needs of West Dapto is reliant on a co-ordinated, equitable contribution from Council, other levels of Government and private sector.*
- 3 *Following exhibition staff report back to Council –*
 - a *A final West Dapto Social Infrastructure Needs Assessment with an engagement report explaining issues raised in submissions and how they were considered; and*
 - b *Detail further steps required to ensure delivery of the Social Infrastructure recommended in the final needs assessment.*

Public exhibition of the draft needs assessment, will be published on Council's website on **Monday 30 January 2023** and will run until **Tuesday 28 February 2023**. Exhibition material will be available from that time through the following link:
