2. Environmental Sustainability Review

Council is updating the Environmental Sustainability Policy and Strategy to ensure these documents reflect current issues and approaches to sustainability. The strategy identifies improvements in sustainability through an improved urban environment and increased active transport. The reference group are invited to provide feedback on sustainability priorities. Feedback from this consultation will help inform a draft strategy for exhibition later in the year.

A representative from Council's engagement team will attend to discuss with the group this review and how to provide feedback.

3. Briometrix: Wheelchair Accessibility Research

The University of Wollongong presented to Council their research on wheelchair accessibility mapping technology. A team of wheelchair pilots used a wheelchair equipped with a tracker which collects footpath data to create useful maps for wheelchair users.

The technology evaluates the routes metre by metre, considering gradients, surface, camber, barriers and effort required by wheelchair users. The map created by Briometrix focused on areas of interest around the CBD such as Crown Street Mall and the Blue Mile.

The output of the data is a map which displays a difficulty level for wheelchair users by using different colours on a google maps style image. This technology aims to assists wheelchair users to make informed and safe decisions on which roads to use prior to beginning their journey.

In the next few months, some maps will be available free online. Council would like to brainstorm the potential of this idea with the group and how this technology may be useful to wheelchair users in the future.

4. Bus Stop Accessibility Audit

In late 2018, Council engaged Obvious Access Pty Ltd to undertake an accessibility audit of all bus stops in the city. The purpose of the audit is to determine compliance of the bus stops with requirements of relevant legislation and nationwide standards (Disability Standards for Accessible Public Transport 2002 and Australian Standard 1428 Design for access and mobility 2001).

Work on the audit is now in its final stages. An overview of the project will be provided to the group including a summary of the key deliverables. The group will have the opportunity to comment on aspects of the project which are of interest which will assist Council in reviewing the findings. A summary of the audit will be available at a later meeting.

5. Forward Planner

A draft forward plan of agenda items for the 2019 Reference Group Meetings has been developed to outline major programs that will be discussed throughout the year. The plan may be amended depending on time constraints.

The two items which were originally planned for this meeting have been deferred to the 6 August meeting. These projects are currently in progress and will require further work prior to presentation to the group.
