2 Infrastructure Delivery Program Review

The public exhibition of the Draft Infrastructure Delivery Program 2019/20-2022/23 is about to commence and feedback from the group will assist Council in finalising the program.

Feedback to be provided by committee members on the Draft 4 year Infrastructure Delivery Program presented at the Tuesday 2 April meeting. This feedback will assist in finalising the Delivery Program at the end of June.

Following this meeting members are requested to follow up on any specific issues through the public exhibition process.

3 Review and Update of Wollongong Bike Plan

The City of Wollongong Bike Plan 2014-18 nominated a number of broad outcomes for cycling in the city and identified a range of issues affecting cycling participation. The plan recommended a range of actions in the following areas:

- Bicycle Network Expansion
- Existing Facility Improvements
- Line marking Improvements
- Directional Signage
- Mountain Biking
- Bicycle Parking
- Planning Controls
- Bicycle Information
- Bicycle Promotion
- Bicycle Education

The review and update of the Wollongong Bike Plan is identified in Council's 2018/22 Delivery Program and Operational Plan as one of a number of actions to *encourage sustainable transport throughout the LGA*. This work will ultimately support the Our Wollongong 2028 goal that: *We have affordable and accessible transport*.

A presentation will be made to the group on the proposed scope for the review and update of the Wollongong Bike Plan. Feedback and suggestions on scope inclusions will be sought from the group at the meeting.

4 Helensburgh Town Centre Plan

Council is preparing the Helensburgh Town Centre Plan which will be a guide for business, residents, governments and community groups. It will provide strategic direction for future development, infrastructure investment, community programs and planning policy.

The Helensburgh Town Centre Plan will set a vision and action plan for the town centre. The Plan can be used to advocate for changes, seek funding sources, change perceptions and inspire enthusiasm for new ideas.

Four beaches were identified as priorities: Austinmer, Thirroul, North Wollongong and Port Kembla.

9 General Business

Action 1: Port Kembla Shared Path Maintenance

Action 1 Response: Council staff has confirmed that vegetation-trimming encroaching on a shared path is carried out when flagged by a Council employee or a member of the public. Street sweeping on shared paths is scheduled on a fortnightly basis.

Action 2: Review of Council Standards

Action 2 Response: Council will take note of all issues relating to standards in the Reference Group meeting and provide a list to Council's design team for review.

Action 3: Accessibility to Schools

Action 3 Response: Council will investigate this issue further and report back at a future meeting.

Action 4: Social Media - Request to set up a Facebook Page

Action 4 Response: A representative from Council's public relations team has advised that a page could be created by a member however would not be endorsed by Council. The page must not resemble a Council webpage and the views must be that of the individual. Posting on relevant forums and pages which already exist may be another option to receive useful feedback.

Action 5: Promoting Behavioural Change

Action 5 Response: Behavioural change will be considered in the review the Bike Plan where applicable. Council promotes various road safety and behavioural change messages through all Local Government Road Safety Program activities and workshops targeting learner drivers and their supervisors, older road users and traffic offenders. These include the Go Together campaign (raising awareness of minimum passing distance), Share the Track (promoting positive interactions between pedestrians and bike riders on shared paths) and discussions raising awareness of the risks facing vulnerable road users.

Other options for promoting behavioural change will be discussed at future meetings where relevant.

Action 6: Accessibility of Local Buses

Action 6 Response: Council traffic engineer has contacted the local bus companies and can confirm the following figures on bus accessibility:

- 75% for Dion's fleet.
- 50% for Premier Illawarra fleet (However 100% accessible is provided on route services and Gong Shuttle). Note that Premier has a much larger fleet of buses.

10 Next Meeting

June 5th Reference Group meeting will focus on Accessibility Audits for Bus Stops, On Street Mobility Parking and the CBD Footpath Priority Process.
