5. SPORTS GRANT PROGRAM -SM

Steve presented the group with a proposed schedule for the forth coming Sports Grant program. 6. SPORTS GROUND STRATEGY 2017-2021

SM reminded the members that WCC would be seeking advice from the individual associations provided

General Business

Cr Dorahy noted the upcoming information night on Barina Park, SM provided an overview of works completed to date (amenities & lighting) and the longer works of completing the feasibility of levelling the site.

Dave Allen suggested that Council start promoting the works achieved via signage at project sites, similar to Communities NSW Sports, comments well received. SM to pursue.

Mark Bond Noted the upcoming presentation of the Cringila Hills Master Plan and the great work achieved to date, noting one of the biggest spends on a new recreational facility. Mark also noted that North Dalton Park and Council were hosting the Sheffield Shield over the Easter weekend (3-6 April). Cr Dorahy questioned what we are doing to promote the event and drive attendance, MB provided an



overview of the strategy. MB also noted that if NSW were at the top of the table, North Dalton may host the final. MB's final comments were to remind the group to review the Delivery Program, Draft Operation Plan and the Fees and Chargers that will be going out on exhibition on the 20th April, closing the 20th May.

Garry Bull noted the NSW boys Hockey Championship on the 14-16 May. Additional comments were that Hockey were seeking funding to resurface the fields and upgrade all the lights to LED as well as a 100kw solar system with Hockey committing to \$270,000 of their own funds.
