1 WELCOME - Chair

6 BUSINESS ARISING FROM PREVIOUS MINUTES

General Business – Parking spaces in Porter Street Wollongong. Chair will refer this matter to Ted Collins, Traffic Unit Manager for further investigation.

7 MALPA PROJECT

'Respected Community Leaders helping young people to learn the Old and the New ways to be healthy'

Don Palmer from the MALPA Project spoke on the beginnings of this Project and how it has grown and enhanced the lives of many children and adults through their work. Copy of Leaflet is a separate attachment to Minutes.

Uncle Richard invited the Project to Bellambi Primary School. There was unanimous agreement that his Project was a great idea and meaningful for the Aboriginal Community.

8 NAIDOC WEEK – GRANT APPLICATIONS

Leanne Olive and Uncle Richard left the meeting for this Item.

Details of applications for NAIDOC Week grants were handed out (copy attached to Minutes). A total of 8 applications were received, however, 3 were ineligible as they did not meet the eligibility criteria for these Grants. There was discussion about whether some of the events outlined in the applications are held as it appeared there is no promotion or information distributed for them. Do the events go ahead and how do we know they were held?

Both Jody Clarke and Armando Reviglio attempt to attend all of the events that have received funding to see that the event was conducted and each applicant must provide an acquittal document outlying that the event was conducted.



The Group recommended the amounts suggested as written in the attachment to be accepted and given as grants to the 5 eligible applications.

9 REQUEST TO RENAME MORTON BAY FIGTREE PARK BY RODNEY KELLY

Rodney Kelly has made a request for the name of this Park to be changed to "Timbery Park". There is a Council procedure in regards to such a request. A letter of support needs to be received and a level of consultation is required, the request in the first part of the process is taken to Executive Management Committee.

Armando Reviglio and Mark Bond (Council's Recreation Services Manager) met with Rodney Kelly on site. It was suggested to Rodney that he contact the Illawarra Aboriginal Land Council seeking direction from them as to other Aboriginal families' views on this name change request. It was agreed that the Illawarra Aboriginal Corporation Cultural Centre is not relevant for Rodney to contact for their opinion in this matter. Rodney's request in regards to a name change is with the Illawarra Aboriginal Land Council and will be considered by them in due course.

The Aboriginal Reference Group agrees that the Illawarra Aboriginal Land Council need to advise first what they view is in regards to this request. A concern was expressed that this may open the door for others to make similar requests for other parks/areas?

When advice is received from the Illawarra Aboriginal Land Council it will be presented to the Aboriginal Reference Group for their information as well as Councils senior management to consider.

10 COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT WORKER UPDATE

- Last week was the launch of I200. To celebrate I200 a postcard has been designed with an "artist's interpretation" of the Illawarra 200 years ago. Jody passed the picture around to members for comment. All members of the Reference Group agreed the "people" portrayed in the picture was not reflective of Aboriginal People of that time period ie the clothes are not accurate. Jody proposed that the postcard should show the picture without people in it which was supported by the Reference Group.
- 2. Reconciliation Week Event. The Reconciliation week event in the Mall amphitheatre on Wednesday 3 June is coming along, particularly the "secret" item (Flashmob) and this will be a symbolic movement of Unity. The Lord Mayor will speak and then an impromptu dance by the Illawarra Flametrees and then the Flashmob will commence. Wet weather arrangements have been made just in case. There will be media activity on the day and a significant amount of Social Media coverage is planned which will enhance this event.
- 3. NAIDOC Week. The Lord Mayor's lunch is on Thursday 9 July at the Botanical Gardens, with the top 10 High Schools with an Aboriginal population (AECG to advice) to meet with the Lord Mayor for lunch and ask questions. Suggestion of 20 students and 1 parent/carer per student, 3 Elders are to be invited to be with the children. What would the eligibility criteria be for choosing the children to attend? A letter will be sent to Principals/AECG to choose from a wide range of students, not just high profile or high achievers but will include a range of Aboriginal students whose skills and abilities are to be recognised. The Reference Group are happy for Jody to finalise these decisions.
- 4. The Regional NAIDOC Week Awards dinner is to be held at Shoalhaven Entertainment Centre 18 July 2015 bus is to be arranged.

11 WELCOME TO COUNTRY

Uncle Richard and Sharralyn Robinson have requested to be added to this list. As this process is a 'grey' area and requires some discussion, it was suggested that Koori time be held for ½ hour prior to the next Aboriginal Reference Group Meeting on 26 August 2015. We have had no quorum for the last few meetings and can only be guided by the amount of Aboriginal members in attendance on this matter

12 GENERAL BUSINESS

- 1. The Land Council have provided a site monitor who is working with Wollongong City Council on site when required while the redesign works for Bald Hill takes place. No specific information on Aboriginal history from the Aboriginal Community that Jody has spoken to has come forward for that area.
- 2. Hill 60. Initial information is still being prepared. It will be 12 months before the Plan of Management will be formed.



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- 4. Sandon Point. Jade Kennedy has been attending the Joint Management Committee meetings. They have had 3 meetings. Jade believes there is still confusion over its structure, which can and can't attend and what authority the "Joint Management Committee" has in regards to Council in saying what activates/purposes that can take place there. He is seeking clarity is required for these points. Martha Tyndall and other Council staff also attend and the Minutes of meetings are being documented. What is "legal status" of the "Joint Management Committee"? Armando, Renee, Sue Savage will meet on Friday to discuss how Council can support the Committee. Councillor Merrin would like to see help given to the group if it's required.
- 5. Basilia and Derek did not receive information about the Reference Group meeting for today. They are to be added to the mail out list for future Reference Group meetings.
