

3 MAJOR PROGRAMS FOR GROUP INPUT

A discussion will be held with members regarding the proposed Agenda Items for the 2019 Reference Group meetings. A number of these meeting items are listed below.

3.1 Infrastructure Delivery Program

The Reference Group members will have the opportunity throughout the year to provide input and feedback on the draft Infrastructure Delivery Program which will assist Council with prioritising projects and finalising the program.

3.2 Mobility Parking

Council is planning to review the mobility parking requirements across the city centre, town centres and special use areas. This may include developing a policy on the appropriate provision of mobility parking.

Council is currently auditing car park accessibility across the city. The Reference group members will have the opportunity to review and provide input on the audit findings and assist in prioritising locations in need of accessibility improvements.

3.3 Bus Stop Accessibility Audit

Council is currently conducting an audit of all bus stops in Wollongong Council area. The audit will provide useful information on the accessibility levels of different bus stops in the area and opportunities for improvement.

The Reference Group will have the opportunity to provide input and feedback on the results of this audit in mid-2019. This feedback will assist in developing a strategy for creating compliant bus stops.

3.4 Wollongong City Centre Access and Movement Strategy Review

The Strategy sets out an integrated transport plan that will support the revitalisation of the City Centre. It addresses all key modes of transport with the aim of achieving Council's vision for a vibrant centre for jobs, key regional services, cultural activity, entertainment and tourism.

The range of proposals contained within the Strategy and implementation action plan will directly improve access for pedestrians, bicycles, public transport, traffic, as well as managing parking supply and demand.

The committee will have the opportunity to review and provide input at key points in the project.

3.5 Bike Plan Review

Council will be undertaking a review of the current Bike Plan later in 2019. The Reference Group will have the opportunity to provide input and feedback at a number of key points in the review.

It is anticipated that a short workshop session will be carried out during one of the group meetings to assist Council in developing the new plan.

3.6 Town and Village Centre Plan Review

The Reference Group will have the opportunity to provide feedback and input on the development of Council's Town And Village Centre Plans.
