- I) West Dapto Road-first 600 meters from the Princes Highway which very badly floods and needs IMMEDIATE attention by WCC as a major upgrade. The rest of West Dapto Road is a total waste of money from ratepayers when 8000 drivers cant even get to the areas past the first 600 meters of West Dapto Road in heavy rainfall events
- II) Yallah Bay Road-this road of 5 kls is being totally destroyed by the heavy trucks used in building the Stage 2 Gas fired Generator at Tallawarra and has dozens of large and medium potholes which are dangerous and WCC is doing nothing about!
- III) Southern half of Lucas Drive -this is a major link road to Fairwater Drive and there are many large and medium potholes yet again in this section as WCC in a another brain snap used light density bitumen instead of heavy density bitumen in its construction.

## Residents renew push for Dapto off-ramps

SHELLHARBOUR MP Anna Watson has launched a petition for M1 motorway on and off ramps at Dapto but residents say they're expecting more disappointment after 40 years of broken promises.

The need for improved road connections to and from Dapto was highlighted again this week as key routes in and out of West Dapto were cut off during heavy rains.

Darkes Road remains closed at Mullet Creek due to flooding earlier in the year and with Bong Bong Road, West Dapto Road and Cleveland Road susceptible to flooding, the only road con-

necting Horsley and Dapto is Fowlers Road.

With tens of thousands of people projected to move into future West Dapto suburbs over the next decades, local residents are calling out for more reliable road connections.

Horsley resident Romeo Cecchele said he had seen the situation coming after 40 years of campaigning.

"The people of West Dapto are tired of waiting for infrastructure to happen," he said.

The first improved connection was promised in the 1980s when the extension of the M1 freeway was built from Berkeley to Kanahooka Road.

"We were supposed to have south-facing ramps as well as north-facing ramps," Mr Cecchele said. "The north-facing ramps got built but the south-facing ramps got cut back due to cost cutting."

In the 2010s, Dapto residents were once again disappointed when a southbound connection was left off the design for the Albion Park Rail bypass, forcing residents to join the M1 at Northcliffe Drive or travel south through Albion Park Rail.

Ms Watson said the congestion currently experienced was only going to get worse.

"With a projected 50,000 further residents expected

to settle in the West Dapto area, residents must be given direct access to and from the M1 motorway as a matter of priority."

Ms Watson said she was hoping to reach 10,000 signatures so the petition would be debated in NSW Parliament.

A Transport for NSW spokesperson said that modelling was undertaken for an interchange at Yallah as part of planning for the Albion Park Rail bypass.

"The traffic modelling, which includes growth around planned residential developments at Yallah and West Dapto, indicates the northern interchange is not required until there is a substantial increase in traffic," the spokesperson said.

Transport for NSW said that Dapto residents travelling south could use the old Princes Highway through Albion Park Rail with 65 per cent of traffic previously using that road now diverted onto the bypass.

Mr Cecchele said that local infrastructure designed for a few farms needed to be upgraded.

"It's been 42 years and six months since the first sod got turned in West Dapto for the first subdivision in January 1980, now all those roads are in such bad condition that it will need all three governments to provide funding to get them all upgraded."

### **Alcohol Free Zones Review**

Wollongong City Council is considering the re-establishment of all Alcohol Free Zones (AFZs), and is seeking feedback to help determine whether they should be reimplemented or changed.

AFZs are located in the suburbs of **Helensburgh, Thirroul, Corrimal, Wollongong, Warrawong, Berkeley** and **Dapto**, and have a four-year term that will expire on 30 September 2022. View [maps of the proposed AFZs for 2022-2026](#).

AFZs aim to improve community safety and prevent disorderly behaviour that can arise when people drink alcohol in a public place. They apply to road-related public areas including footpaths, roads and car parks and hold a four-year term, after which point they are reviewed and re-established if required.

AFZs exist as a partnership between Wollongong City Council and NSW Police. Council facilitates the community engagement process, review, and sign installation, while NSW Police Officers enforce the zone.

NSW Police powers enable officers to tip out or otherwise dispose of alcohol being consumed in an AFZ. The main focus is to deter irresponsible drinking without imposing fines on potentially disadvantaged people. NSW Police can also use 'move on' powers in any public place where they believe, on reasonable grounds, that the person's behaviour is in accordance with the rules associated with the 'move on direction'.
