6. FEE WAIVER COVID-19

Cr Rimmer provided an overview of the Fee waiver adopted by Council on the 31 August 2020 and thanked Crs Dorahy and Waters for their support on the floor of Council in adopting the resolution of the fee waiver. Mark Bond spoke to the item, highlighting the need to demonstrate the flow on benefit for the clubs. Below is the extract of the minutes for additional information and clarification.



429 ITEM 3 - ASSISTANCE FOR LICENSEES OF COUNCIL'S COMMUNITY FACILITIES AND SPORTING GROUNDS

COUNCIL'S RESOLUTION - RESOLVED UNANIMOUSLY on the motion of Councillor Rimmer seconded Councillor Dorahy that Council recognises the impact of the Covid-19 pandemic on community licensees, sporting clubs and local associations, via the following provisions —

a Licensees of community facilities, allocated under Council's Allocation of Community Facilities to Community Groups Policy and 355 Committees of Council Ordinary Meeting of Council 31 August 2020 4 Minute No. be provided with the opportunity to apply for financial support for payment of essential outgoings, up to a maximum of \$5,000 per licence, for the 2020/2021 financial year b Provision of assistance to be subject to application and based on an analysis of each applicant's financial capacity.

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a Local sports clubs and associations be provided with the opportunity to apply for a conditional 100% waiver of sportsground ground hire fees applicable throughout the impacted winter training and competition period from 25 May 2020 to 17 October 2020

b This waiver will be subject to the State and Local sports associations providing evidence that they are providing a minimum of a 20% reduction to registration/affiliation/capitation fees in addition to other forms of player subsidy to local clubs which may include costs of team nomination fees, insurance and/or referee costs. This waiver excludes costs associated with the provision of sportsfield lighting to fields.

Recommendation: Information be received.

7. UCI CYCLING 2022 - Mark Bond

Mark Bond provided and overview on the UCI 2022 World cycling event planned for Wollongong from Sunday 18 September to Sunday 25 September 2022 which will host elite men, women and juniors cyclists. Mark outlined that this event would draw a significant world and local spectator audience with increased tourism having a positive impact on our economy.

Questions were raised specifically in relation to notification of sporting groups, broader community dissemination via various media forums and the possibilities of relocating sports. It was confirmed that Council would establish clear communication lines, specifically with the Sports & Facilities Reference Group in relation to the impact on Sports. Mark spoke about the preference to rescheduling winter draws due to the large number of visitors to the area, increased traffic and the road closures associated with the event at this stage.

Recommendation: Information be received.

8. SPORTS GRANT PRESENTATION - S Maidment

This year the Sports Grant Program commenced on 23 June 2020 and ran for a period of 6 weeks, closing on 31 July 2020. The success of this process continues to grow in popularity with the local sporting clubs. This year Council received a record number of applications (23) to be assessed for the current financial year.

The combined projects have a net value of \$2,153,979, with the sporting clubs contributing \$320,274 and requesting financial assistance from Council to the value of \$1,833,705

The marking panel consisting of Dave Allen, Garry Bull, Rob Summers and Bruce Whalan, have meet on a number of occasions via skype to review, discuss and rank the 23 applications. Below is a summary of the applications and the comments from the marking panel.

The panel believes that this could result in significant financial burden on future reserves and recommends that Wollongong City Council officers engage with the club to work out a way forward or alternatively Council undertake the design to ensure compliance to Wollongong City Council standards. The panel is not supportive of project proceeding through this process, however supports the ranking and score allocated.

We also wish to amend a section of the existing track to improve rider safety and entertainment. We wish to engage a professional engineer and designer/builder to incorporate the local surrounding area vision and roots of the town into the design. HORCC Club signage display with well-advertised assistance of Wollongong City Council's support and the promotion of healthy and active lifestyles. We have the evidence, we have the experience to see how well this project is going in the Northern Illawarra and we wish to continue momentum with its progression. We would love some support of the local council in doing so, we have got this far with chasing grants and self-funding. This site would benefit from council assistance.

Panel's Recommendation The panel is not supportive of project proceeding through this process. The panel recommends that WCC officers commence conversations and work with the club to determine a way forward however the panel supports the ranking and score allocated.

Following the presentation Cr Rimmer, supported by CRs Dorahy & Waters, expressed their appreciation to the marking panel, noting the time and effort involved in reviewing all of the 23 submissions and producing a thorough and concise report for the Reference group to consideration. Cr Rimmers suggested that Council officers prepare a briefing note for Councils information and ensure that conversation are initiated with the unsuccessful applicants to improve their opportunities in the future.

General conversation followed on the potential improvements to the process, with Steve to have further dialog with the marking panels, collating their comments to share with the rest of the reference group in an endeavour to improve the process.
