- 4 CONFIRMATION OF MINUTES OF MEETING HELD ON 29 JULY 2014

Recommendation: The minutes of the meeting held on 29 July 2014 be confirmed as a true and accurate record. Moved Cr Curran, seconded Mark Bond

5 BUSINESS ARISING FROM PREVIOUS MINUTES- update provided by Steve Maidment, noting continuation of Insurance issues, general discussion followed, SM to clarify the insurance on the Netball Facility and potential timeframes.

Recommendation: Information be received and noted.

6 2014 SPORTS PLANNING PROCESS- ASSSESMENT- SM provided an update on the applications, noting 16 submissions received (highest number received to-date), scored and ranked, 1 submission received after closing date, not consider as a valid submission.

The rankings below indicate the 8 highest ranked projects (shaded) recommended to be progressed for funding (noting the annual allocation of \$250,000 [\$150k council capital & \$100k from the telecommunication income] for the Sports Reserve).

General discussion followed with Cr Curran and Cr Kershaw questioning why Council were asking clubs to come through the Sports Planning Process and the Sports Reserve to fund field drainage. SM provided some background noting the licensed fields require the licensee to make good on capital improvements and

maintenance and they usually seek either State Government or WCC Sports Reserve to assist in the funding works. SM also noted that Council's Infrastructure Strategy and Planning Division don't consider green items such as playing fields, green tees, and turf cricket wickets as a capital asset and therefore aren't funded under the existing capital budget allocation. This approach places significant pressure on the current sports field maintenance budget, which for the entire city is approximately \$182,000 with \$80-\$100,000 on topdressing and aeration of only 10-12 out of the City's 220 playing surfaces and the remainder on incidental such as goal mouth repairs.

It was also noted by Cr Curran that the Draft Sports Ground and Sports Facilities Strategy will be an important reference document for the future prioritising and provision of sports facilities throughout the local government area and will assist in identifying potential shortfalls in capital allocations.
